

Proclamation

Whereas, every year in the United States approximately 178,000 people die from alcohol related causes; and

Whereas, alcohol use disorder (AUD) affects about 29 million people in the United States; and

Whereas, about 3.3 million adolescents aged 12 to 20 drank excessively within the last 30 days; and

Whereas, in 2023, emergency rooms saw more than 4 million visits due to alcohol-related issues; and

Whereas, underage alcohol use may result in death or serious injuries, suicides, poisonings, drownings, sexual assaults, poor athletic and academic performance; and

Whereas, adult misuse of alcohol may cause injury and death and may lead to chronic adverse health conditions; and

Whereas, in West Virginia, key stakeholders such as law enforcement, educators, prevent specialists, parents, coaches, mentors, local, county and state governmental organizations are committed to addressing the serious dangers of the misuse and illegal use of alcohol; and

Whereas, the West Virginia Alcohol Beverage Control Administration (WVABCA) is deeply committed to the proper licensing of businesses and through its education and enforcement programs is working to protect the public.

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved that I, Patrick Morrisey, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim *April 2025* as:

Alcohol Awareness Month

in the Mountain State and encourage all citizens to help to prevent the underage consumption of alcohol and the adult misuse of alcohol.
